- 3. Implementing evidence based practice.**
Improving the effectiveness of implementation of evidence based practice, with a focus

on strategies for translating theory into practice.

Topics which support the theme of the Congress may include; managing the challenges of a public and political environment, developing models of best practice that consider community views, engaging and informing the community, and managing violent, sexual and radicalised offenders in the community.

Selection of papers will be based on the strength of demonstration of practical success, research methodology and evidence, and innovation. Priority will be given to papers that relate to the theme.
